Dear Members,

I have pleasure to present the Annual Report of our Trust for the year ending 31st March 2014. Our last Annual General meeting was held on Saturday 25th January 2014 at Auditorium in Jaslok Hospital, Mumbai where our Trustees, Members, & Committee Members from all our Centres were present. At the meeting we share each others views and experiences which helps other centre to implement schemes to improve the working of the centre.

Our committee members at the various Centres are the main people who put in all efforts to reach out to the poor community people living in slum areas of Agra, Ajmer, Ahmedabad, Bhopal, Bikaner, Bhilwara, Chittogarh, Gandhidam, Jaipur, Nagpur, Rajkot, Udaipur, & Vadodara and make sure that the people are helped out in whatever manner possible by the Trust.

<u>Most successful scheme is the SOFT LOAN SCHEME</u>. This scheme helps the beneficiaries to purchase raw materials or any other instruments which will increase his/her income. The loan is given for purchase of Handcarts, Bicycles, Sewing machines, or any other necessary household items like gas connections, fans, iron bed, electric connections and blankets on loan basis.

In some centres depending upon the status of the family, fees for learning various courses like Computer Course, Sewing, Embroidery, and Beautician course are also given on loan basis. Many have benefited from these schemes and have started their own small business and are operating from their homes.

Initially all these amounts were given free, but now depending upon the condition of the family loan is provided either by taking some amount from the beneficiary or on installment basis so that they feel proud and responsible of earning on their own and returning the money taken back to the Trust. This way they can support their families with respect.



<u>SUNSHINE TRUST SCHOLARSHIP</u> .Scholarship is given to bright and needy students for higher education. The scoring limit for boys is **70**% and for girls is **60**%.

This effort of Sunshine Trust has brought life to Senior Citizen and they feel part of the society and not feel neglected.

These meetings have been appreciated by the local people and they have come forward to assist in such meetings. We have suggested having such meetings at least twice a month. All expenses are borne by the Trust.

Our main motto is to reduce the number of community people living below poverty line. We have achieved this to some extent through following activities:

- ❖ Provide assistance to families at the time of their daughter's marriage.
- ❖ Provide assistance at the time of an accident or any other medical emergency
- Provide assistance in restoring/repairing houses/residences at the time of an emergency.
- ❖ Provide assistance at the time of death of any family member
- Provide tools to enable people to earn a living and support their families including handcart, sewing machine and bicycles etc.
- * Provide educational assistance to at least one family member in any field of their choice to enable them to earn a living and support their family.
- Provide soft loan to assist in the purchase of raw materials needed to start a small business to enable people to earn a living and support his family
- Try to establish Computer centre at all Trust Centres to educate students and enable them to find suitable jobs for themselves.
- **Section** Establish homes for the old aged and widows
- ❖ Sunshine Trust Scholarships for higher education to talented students Boys scoring 70% & Girls 65%
- Senior Citizen Club at all Centres
- ❖ Book bank in all the Centres from 1 to 10th standard where poor student can take the Text Books and return them after completing the academic year.

We want to ensure the poor people of community that, incase of any emergency or calamity, they can approach our organization "SUNSHINE TRUST" for help.



With your continued support, we can extend our list of activities and encompass more people & areas in which we are able to offer assistance.

Report of Centres for the year ended 31st March 2014

Committee Members of all Centres have served the community people under the objectives of the Trust. We give below some of the activities of each centre in which they have shown outstanding performances. Amounts disbursed below Rs.10,000/-under any heading are not shown in individual reports of the center.

AGRA

The Annual amount allocated is Rs.2,90,000/-. plus additional amount of Rs.58,000/- towards Education to school students and Sunshine Trust Scholarship of Rs. 10,000/- to 3 students for higher education.

Total amount disbursed Rs 1,17,727/- to 224 people details as under

Agra has always shown outstanding performance in training the students in various fields, like tailoring, embroidery, beautician, fashion designing, Mehendi and basic computer knowledge. They prefer educating girls so that they are of some help to the family even after marriage. Initially fees were given free, but now it is to be refunded to the trust on instalment basis so that the same amount can be given to some other needy person. Committee members also assist in getting them good jobs in industries, offices etc.

For marriage help instead of giving cash, they prefer giving them a bag containing personal and necessary items which will be of some help to the girl after marriage. They also assist in arranging the wedding ceremony in the Temple or Dharamshala with minimum or no charges depending upon the status of the family.

<u>AHMEDABAD</u>

The Annual amount allocated is Rs.1,45,000/-. plus additional amount of Rs. 29,000/- towards Education to school students and Sunshine Trust Scholarship of Rs. 10,000/- to 2 Students

Total amount disbursed Rs.79511/- to 36 people details as under

This year more attention has been given for Training courses / Education of students so that they can earn and live a respected life.

AJMER

The Annual amount allocated is Rs.2,90,000/-. plus additional amount of Rs.58,000/- towards Education to school students and Sunshine Trust Scholarship of Rs. 10,000/- to 3 students

Total amount disbursed Rs. 3.12,210/- to 86 people details as under

According to the committee members it is difficult to eradicate poverty they are trying their best to assist them by way of self employment scheme.

Maximum amount has been given for Self help scheme for employment on loan basis. This scheme has worked out successfully in this centre. The amount received back is kept in fixed deposit & nearly Rs.5,54,762/- is in bank. They encouraged the applicant to take loan instead of giving them free. People who do not give the instalment are made to understand that this is Trust money & they should return this back so that others are helped in same manner.

Senior citizens club is well organized fortnightly, they have healthy, enjoyable & spiritual atmosphere. Meeting starts with satsang, bhajans, simple yoga exercise simran & jap They are made aware of various common diseases and use of homemade medicine.

Birthdays of Senior citizen are celebrated, freedom fighters are honoured. International Old age day is celebrated they are also taken out for picnics. Cultural programs are organized on Festival days like Holi, Chetichand, Daserra, Diwali



BHILWARA

The Annual amount allocated is Rs.1,50,000/-. plus additional amount of Rs. 30,000/- towards Education to school students and Sunshine Trust Scholarship of Rs. 10,000/- to 1 students Plus uniforms to 200 students every year approx budget for this is Rs.42,000/-

Total amount disbursed Rs. 1,68,453/- to 52 people details as under

Maximum amount has been spent for Self employment scheme. This scheme has increased over the years, during this year they have received back an amount of Rs.3,43,520/- from 634 people the amount is deposited in bank. This scheme will definitely bring down the poverty limit in this centre.

Every year separate fund of approx Rs. 42,000/- is given towards uniforms for 200 poor school student who cannot afford to buy uniform for themselves.

BHOPAL

The Annual amount allocated is Rs.2,18,000/- plus additional amount of Rs. 43,600/- towards Education to school students and Sunshine Trust Scholarship of Rs. 10,000/- to 3 students

Total amount disbursed Rs. 2,48,533/- to 345 people details as under

Maximum amount is given for medical & education. Self employment scheme is given to 9 people who now have small business like retails cloth, Utensils & fruit vendors TV repairs, Pan Masala, Kirana shops & ladies fancy items shops.

Medical help is maximum in this centre as most of the community people are living in slums and are prune to sickness like TB and animal bites (pig/dog) for this they require immediate injections which are expensive not available in Government hospitals they have to purchase from chemist.

Committee members are also members of other Trust who help in other schemes which are not covered by Sunshine Trust objectives eg every year they organise Joint Thread Ceremony

BIKANER

The Annual amount allocated is Rs.1,00,000/- plus additional amount of Rs.20,000/- towards Education to school students and Sunshine Trust Scholarship of Rs.10,000/- to 1 students

Total amount disbursed Rs. 53,000/- to 19 people details as under

This is a small centre maximum help is given by Sadhu Vaswani Mission, Pune thus they are not able to utilized the funds allotted to them.

Apart from the objective of the Trust they carry out various other activities like Eye operation camps, Blood donation camp, free medical checkups, distribution of ration to widows & old, Animal camp in villages.

IAIPUR

The Annual amount allocated is Rs.2,90,000/- plus additional amount of Rs. 58,000/- towards Education to school students and Sunshine Trust Scholarship of Rs.10,000/- to 3 students

An additional amount of Rs. 25,000/- is give towards fees of 50 poor school students for Rs. 500/- each.

Total amount disbursed Rs. 3,63,450/- to 294 people details as under

Jaipur has been working since 1996 They have succeeded in providing job oriented items on loan basis like Cycle rickshaw, handcarts, sewing machine and other items on installment basis which has improved the life of many families.

Senior Citizen club is well organized in Satsang Bhawan where around 200 seniors citizen participate. Meeting starts with Satsang & Bhajans they give flowers, stick and shawls to some of them. Smiles on their face at the end of the meeting shows their happiness.

NAGPUR

The Annual amount allocated is Rs.2,90,000/-plus additional amount of Rs.58,000/- towards Education to school students and Sunshine Trust Scholarship of Rs. 10,000/- to 3 students

An additional amount of Rs.16,000/- is give towards Book Bank

Total amount disbursed Rs.3,11,667/- to 118 people details as under

The centre is working since 1995 under the guidance & policies laid down by the Trust. The members meet on a Sunday morning at the office of Sindhi Social Forum situated in the slum area of Jaripatka surrounded by poor community people. In emergencies, they meet at any of the member's office in the evening.

Assistance of any kind is given after thorough investigation. Items like sewing machine, handcart, bicycle is handed over to the beneficiaries with a note "PROPERTY OF SUNSHINE TRUST NOT FOR SALE" Every precaution is taken to avoid misuse of the item.



Sewing machine is given only to those who know sewing, they are asked to demonstrate on the machine which is kept in the office. They take 50% from the applicant as recovery procedure is not possible

For Hand Cart the applicants are asked to first commence business on rented handcarts for few months then only they are given hand cart on instalment basis.

This year bicycle has been given to working people so that they can reach to their work place in time. The beneficiary are asked to deposit 50% with the supplier and balance is paid by the Trust.

The Book Bank for school students was initially started by Melwani Trust. It is now is supported by Sunshine Trust they purchase books from class 1 to 10th standard. Poor students take the Text books and return after completing the academic year. This year they have spent Rs.15,071/- towards purchase of various books

RAJKOT

The Annual amount allocated is Rs.1,00,000/-plus additional amount of Rs.20,000/- towards Education to school students and Sunshine Trust Scholarship of Rs. 10,000/- to 1 students

They have been working under the guidance of the Trust they have served the community people for 11 year. In case of marriage the amount is given directly to the shop from where they have bought the items required by the girl.

In case of medical, amounts are given directly to the hospitals, chemist or doctors and not to the patients. This has kept a check on misuse of the amount disbursed.

Under the Self Employment scheme they prefer taking some amount from the applicant as they find it difficult to collect monthly installments.

They organize Senior Citizen meet every month. The meeting starts with Satsang & Prayers they share old memories & experience of their life. "Importance of Yoga in our life" was discussed with them which



has improved their health. Local people have appreciated this gathering and they contribute some amount towards the expense & balance is paid by Sunshine Trust.

UDAIPUR

The Annual amount allocated is Rs.1,50,000/- plus additional amount of Rs. 30,000/- towards Education to school students and Sunshine Trust Scholarship of Rs. 10,000/- to 2 students

Udaipur centre has always shown outstanding performance in all the projects undertaken by them. This year they maximum amount is towards Education of community people.

They distribute stationery to poor students every year. They have adopted a small school which is mainly run for beggar's children and for those who are forced to work in their childhood due to economic conditions of their family.

The best social activity is that they have a social forum where they solve all types of family dispute so that they are not taken to court for settlement.

VADORODA

The Annual amount allocated is Rs.2,38,,000/-plus additional amount of Rs.47,600/- towards Education to school students and Sunshine Trust Scholarship of Rs.10,000/- to 3 students

Total amount disbursed Rs.1,34,024/- to 66 people details as under

This year more attention has been given for self employment by giving Hand Cart to people for selling fruits, vegetable, footwear & snacks, bicycle are granted people for hawker business like pan-padiko, bakery items, pickles so that they can earn their living and support the family.



They prefer collecting some amount from the applicant instead giving loan and collect on installments basis, as they are unable to collect the installment amounts.

Diwali celebration is appreciated by the people and number of people are increasing every year thus they have requested to increased the amount as the cost of items have also increased.

Senior Citizen club is already registered in Vadodara at Sant Kanwar Colony. It is functioning properly, all expense are borne by the local people.

GANDHIDAM

The Annual amount allocated is Rs.2,00,000/- this centre has been started after nearly 4-5 years

Total amount disbursed Rs.43,500/- to17 People details as under

The Committee member of this center has a school thus maximum amount is spent on education the poor children.

BHAGWAN KALA KENDRA- BHOPAL

This is a vocational training institution in Bhopal (Part of Jeev Seva Sansthan) which gives training in various Vocational courses.

Looking at the good work and improvement in lives of people, the Trust has decided to support those families and students who cannot afford to pay any fees to learn the course.

The total amount disbursed during this year is Rs.1,18,970/- for 625 students towards deficit in fees for training in various vocational courses.

Sunshine Trust has been supporting this Vocational Institute for past 15 years, nearly 5578 students have benefited from this institute and are having good jobs or small business.



DEEPAVALI CELEBRATION

Every year Deepavali Celebration is organized with the help of Sunshine Trust Committee members in all the Centres of our Trust.

The Committee Members invite poor community people, organize a small variety program and give them good meal, at the end of the function they are given packets of sweets, candles and firecrackers.

Our Community persons were entertained in all the Centres in a true spirit and SUNSHINE brought in their life of poor people. Following amount was sent to the centre for celebration.

ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN DURING THE YEAR

- * "Sunshine Scholarship" is given to Bright students for higher education who have scored more than 60% for girls and 70% for boys.

 Rs.98,500/- given to 13 students
- ❖ Twenty Percent of Annual allocation to Centres is added to the annual budget only if they utilize it for education of poor students towards fees, books and uniforms sweaters, & shoes have been added this year.

 This year Rs. 5,20,092/- has been given to 646 students
- ❖ In Jaipur every year an amount of Rs.25000/- is given to Jaipur centre towards School fees of 50 poor students
- ❖ Book Bank in Nagpur centre where students take the books for the term and return after passing the exams. We plan to have such Book Bank in all Centres This year they have paid Rs.15,071/- paid for books.
- School uniforms are given to poor students in Bhilwara centre this year Rs. 57,550/-was spent on uniforms for 195 students
- ❖ Help has been given to students in various training courses so that they can earn and support the family. This year Rs. 1,13,205 has been given 63 students.
- ❖ Diwali celebration is organized at all Centres for the poor people, this was initiated by New York Members. Now it is supported by Sunshine Trust. Total amount of Rs. 2,05,000/- disbursed to centers
- Senior Citizen club started at all Centres, where they are entertained, tea and biscuit is served at the end of the meeting. Total amount spent on such meetings Rs. 30,967/-
